Thank you for asking me to see this patient whom I saw in my clinic today with his chronic back pain secondary to the old T5,6,7 fractures. The main problem is that these were not simple wedge fractures, they involved quite a lot of lateral compression so he has a localised scolissis. He has noticed this himself by virtue of the fact that one shoulder stands up higher than the other.

I think the right thing to do here is to take some positive steps. We have got to establish exactly where the pain is coming from, and we can do this best with pain reproduction studies under X-ray control.

Because this is threatening his whole career in the Police Force we will be bringing him in within three months to do this.
